### **Culture Shakespeare**

Basic History of Shakespeare and His Importance

### Who was William Shakespeare?

William Shakespeare (1564–1616) was an English writer and actor. He is known as one of the greatest writers in the history of the English language. He was born in Stratford-upon-Avon, England, and wrote plays and poems that are still famous today. Shakespeare wrote more than 39 plays and over 150 poems called sonnets.

### What kind of plays did he write?

Shakespeare wrote three main types of plays:

- 1. Tragedies These are sad stories about people who face problems and often end badly (e.g., Macbeth, Romeo and Juliet).
- 2. Comedies These are funny and happy stories with problems that work out in the end (e.g., A Midsummer Night's Dream, Twelfth Night).
- 3. Histories These are stories about kings and historic events in England (e.g., Henry V, Richard III).

### Why is Shakespeare important?

- 1. His Stories Are Universal:
- Shakespeare's plays talk about themes like love, ambition, jealousy, betrayal, and family, which are still important to people today.
- 2. He Shaped the English Language: Shakespeare invented many new words and phrases that are still used in English today. For example, phrases like break the ice and wild goose chase, come from his plays!
- 3. *His Characters Feel Real:* Shakespeare's characters are full of emotions, thoughts, and feelings that many people can relate to, even after 400 years.
- 4. Cultural Influence: His works have inspired movies, books, art, and music all over the world. Many famous stories, like \*The Lion King\*, are based on Shakespeare's ideas!

### **Fun Facts About Shakespeare:**

- He lived during the Elizabethan Era, a time when Queen Elizabeth I ruled England.
- His plays were performed in a theater called \*The Globe\* in London.
- He never went to university, but he became famous through his poetry and plays.
- He died at age 52 and is buried in his hometown, Stratford-upon-Avon.
- -wrote 39 plays-154 sonnets

### Why Should We Read Shakespeare?

Even though Shakespeare's English sounds old and difficult, his stories and ideas teach us a lot about people and life. By reading Shakespeare, we can also learn more about English and improve our language skills!

### William Shakespeare used three main styles in his works:

### 1. Verse (Poetry)

- Shakespeare often wrote in iambic pentameter, a rhythm with 10 syllables per line where every second syllable is stressed. This style gave his language a musical quality.
  - Example: From Romeo and Juliet:"But, soft! what light through yonder window breaks?"

### 2. Prose (Ordinary Speech)

- Prose is everyday language without a specific rhythm or structure. Shakespeare used this style for comic characters, casual conversations, or to show the simplicity of certain characters.
  - Example: From \*As You Like It\*:
- "The more pity that fools may not speak wisely what wise men do foolishly."

### 3. Rhyme

- Shakespeare occasionally used rhyming couplets (two lines that rhyme) for dramatic effect, particularly at the end of scenes or speeches.
  - Example: From \*A Midsummer Night's Dream:
  - "The course of true love never did run smooth.
  - So quick bright things come to confusion soon."

These different styles allowed Shakespeare to convey emotions and ideas in various ways, making his work vibrant and versatile.

### **Summary of Macbeth**

Macbeth is a brave soldier who fights for the king of Scotland, Duncan. After a battle, three witches tell Macbeth that he will become king one day. This makes Macbeth very curious and ambitious. His wife, Lady Macbeth, encourages him to kill King Duncan so that he can take the throne.

Macbeth kills the king, but he starts to feel guilty and scared. To protect himself, he kills more people. He becomes paranoid and starts to lose trust in everyone, even his closest friends.

Meanwhile, Duncan's son, Malcolm, and another soldier, Macduff, plan to fight Macbeth and take back the throne. At the end of the story, Macduff fights Macbeth and kills him. Malcolm becomes the new king of Scotland, and peace is restored.

**Title:** Imagine You Are a Character in Macbeth

**Instructions:** Imagine you are one of the characters in \*Macbeth\* (Macbeth, Lady Macbeth, Banquo, or even one of the witches). Write a short diary entry (5-6 sentences) about something that happened in the story.

### Ideas to help you get started:

- If you are Macbeth, write about how you feel after hearing the witches' prophecy.
- If you are Lady Macbeth, write about what you are thinking after convincing Macbeth to kill King Duncan.
- If you are Banquo, write about your feelings when you see Macbeth become king.
- If you are one of the witches, write about your next plan for Macbeth.

### **Example Starter:**

\_"I am Macbeth, and my heart is heavy. The witches said I will be king, but how will that happen? The idea of killing King Duncan frightens me, but now I can't stop thinking about it. Should I listen to my ambition or keep my loyalty to the king I serve?"\_

This short exercise encourages students to think from a character's point of view while using simple, accessible language.

**Title:** Understanding Romeo and Juliet

**Instructions**: This exercise is based on the main story of \*Romeo and Juliet\*. Read the short summary of the play below and answer the questions. Try your best! If you need help, ask a teacher or classmate!

### **Summary of Romeo and Juliet**

Romeo and Juliet is a tragic love story set in Verona, Italy. Romeo, a young man from the Montague family, falls in love with Juliet, a young woman from the Capulet family. However, their families are bitter enemies and do not want them to be together.

Despite the feud, Romeo and Juliet secretly get married with the help of Friar Laurence, who hopes their union will bring peace. However, their happiness is short-lived. After a fight, Romeo kills Juliet's cousin, Tybalt, and is banished from Verona.

Juliet's parents try to force her to marry another man, so she seeks Friar Laurence's help. The Friar gives her a sleeping potion that makes her appear dead, hoping to reunite her with Romeo. Tragically, Romeo does not receive the message explaining this plan. Believing Juliet is truly dead, he takes poison and dies. When Juliet wakes up and sees Romeo dead, she also takes her own life.

In the end, the deaths of Romeo and Juliet bring the Montague and Capulet families together in grief, and they finally end their fighting.
